		a stem
Class VI	David Austin Roses	1 stem with 1 or more flowers (with or without
		side buds).
Class VII	Miniature bloom	1 stem with 1 or more flowers or buds (with or
		without side buds).

Class IX	Vase of Roses	Up to 8 stems (for decorative effect).

- The hall will be open to stage exhibits at 11:30am and will close at 12:25pm. There will be no entry to the hall from 12:25pm while judging is taking place.
- Judging will commence at 12:30pm through to 1pm.



Class 1 – Exhibition bloom

The ideal exhibition bloom is one which is $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ open with plenty of petals, arranged gracefully in a circular outline.

If you have a long stem, leaves healthy and in proportion to the stem, well-spaced. This class is one (1) bloom, no side buds.

Points received:

Flower: 40 points
Freshness & substance: 30 points
Stem & foliage: 30 points



Class 2 - Decorative bloom

This has a long, pointed bud, usually having fewer petals than an exhibition bloom. Blooms in this class should be ¼ to ½ open.

Blooms looking up at the judge are important.

This class is one (1) bloom, no side buds.

Points received:

Flower: 30 points
Freshness & substance: 40 points
Stem & foliage: 30 points



Class 3 - Fully Open bloom

Similar to an Exhibition bloom, except that the bloom should be past $\frac{3}{4}$ open stage and still look fresh, not old or tired.

Stamens need not be showing, but if they are, they must still be yellow, not brown. This class is one (1) bloom, no side buds.



Class 4 - Floribunda

One stem of roses with no more than three flowers open on a stem.

This class must have a reasonable stem, evenly spaced with or without buds. Flower head must be well-balanced and in proportion to the stem.



Class 5 – Heritage

Old fashioned – can be 1 or more blooms on a stem



Class 7 - Miniature bloom

One stem with one or more flowers or buds (with or without side buds).



Class 6 – David Austin roses

One stem with one or more flowers (with or without side buds).



<u>Class 8 – Rose floating in own</u> <u>stemmed glass</u>

Short stem flower <u>must</u> be floating on top of the water, not touching the sides of the glass (own stemmed glass to be used).
